
Staff News

School News

We have had a positive response from prospective students and their families to our recent media campaign. Interviews are currently being held and some students will soon commence a transition period so that they are more comfortable with their new learning environment. We will continue to keep class size at a minimum in line with our philosophy of providing opportunities for students to grow and achieve success through a smaller, more supportive environment.

As part of our C.A.P (Community Access Program) we have continued to host and visit a range of services within our local area. At the end of last term we visited Youth Links, who are a specialised support service for young people. WRCS students presented key workers with a hamper of donated grocery items to be given to those who may find themselves at risk or homeless. The service was extremely appreciative of this act of generosity. Our students also had the opportunity to take part in 'Drum Beat'. Used across a variety of settings, including schools and health services, this program combines music and physical activity to reflect emotions, attitudes and thoughts, promoting social and emotional learning. The experience was enjoyed by all who participated and it is hoped that students will have access to the program on an ongoing basis in the near future.

Snr Sargent Alex Davies from Griffith Local Area Command continues to attend our school on a weekly basis, facilitating programs for our students. Alex is currently working with students on a program regarding money and finances. The knowledge acquired will be beneficial as they become more financially independent, allowing them to be more confident consumers and money managers.

Students are currently visiting Citi Gym on a weekly basis to improve their fitness levels and become familiar with the processes, protocols and procedures of attending a reputable fitness venue. WRCS promotes the philosophy of a 'healthy body/healthy mind' and whilst this may be a new experience for many, the students (and staff) are actively participating and enjoying the benefits of improved fitness levels.



School News

Geography - This term we have been looking at 'Urbanisation'. Recently Sue, Alison and students took a bus drive around town to observe some of Griffith's heritage buildings and sites. We compared photos of the original buildings to the way they look today. Some that were easily compared included St Alban's cathedral, the development of Collina and the Griffith courthouse. Work experience - Students continue to attend work experience with a range of employers within the local area. Work experience allows for our young people to not only develop skills but also increases their self-confidence and social skills. Currently we have students working in the childcare, building and business administration area.



TAFE - YES Program (Youth Engagement Strategy)

Several of our students are currently enrolled in training courses at Griffith TAFE. Conducted one day per week, for four weeks the 'YES Program' (Youth Engagement Strategy) allows for students to experience first-hand vocational training in an adult educational facility along with other students. Students welcomed the opportunity to access the program and for those who are making the transition to further study next year the course has been a positive experience. Students are currently enrolled in nursing, childcare, hair, beauty and automotive skills. All students have thoroughly enjoyed the experience and have recommended the program to other WRCS students if/when it is conducted again next year.
